Monthly Placemats

QUILTED WITH BINDING

FINISHED PLACEMAT SIZE 11" x 18"
MAKES 6 PLACEMATS

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting techniques and terminology. The placemat diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Hester & Cook May Monthly Placemat Panel (PD13928-PANEL)

1 yard Green Gingham (C13944-GREEN) for binding

OTHER SUPPLIES

Basic Sewing Supplies

1¼ yard Pink Peony (C13929-PINK) for backing

(6) 13" x 20" Pieces of Batting

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

- Please read instructions before cutting fabrics.
- Cutting Instructions are based on a 42" WOF.
- Refer to the photo for the placement of each of the fabrics.
- Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.
- Actual panel measurements may vary from digital panel measurements. Therefore, trimming instructions are provided for the panel and all borders to ensure accuracy. Follow trimming instructions carefully. Accurate measuring techniques are key.



May Monthly Placemat Panel

Cut (6) 11" x 18"



Pink Peony

Cut (6) 14" x 21"



Green Gingham

Cut (12) 2½" x WOF strips for binding

PLACEMAT ASSEMBLY

1. Layer the backing wrong side up, followed by the batting and the placemat panel right side up.



2. Baste and quilt as desired.
3. Trim excess batting and backing.

4. Use your preferred method to bind your quilt using the binding strips.



Monthly Placemats

QUILTED WITH BORDERS & BINDING

FINISHED PLACEMAT SIZE 15 ½" x 22 ½"

MAKES 6 PLACEMATS

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WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Hester & Cook November Monthly Placemat Panel (PD13940-PANEL)

1¾ yards Orange Gingham (C13944-ORANGE) for binding

OTHER SUPPLIES

Basic Sewing Supplies

¾ yards Brown Thankful (C13941-BROWN) for backing

(6) 17½" x 24½" Pieces of Batting

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

- Please read instructions before cutting fabrics.
- Cutting Instructions are based on a 42" WOF.
- Refer to the photo for the placement of each of the fabrics.
- Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.
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November Monthly Placemat Panel

Cut (6) 11½" x 18½"



Brown Thankful

Cut (6) 18½" x 25½"



Orange Gingham

Cut (12) 2½" x WOF strips for borders; subcut:

(12) 2½" x 11½" rectangles

(12) 2½" x 22½" rectangles

Cut (12) 2½" x WOF strips for binding

PLACEMAT ASSEMBLY

1. With RST, sew side borders to the left and right sides of the panel. Press. Next, with RST sew the top and bottom borders to the top and bottom of the panel. Press. Placemat top should measure 15½" x 22½".



2. Layer the backing wrong side up, followed by the batting and the placemat panel right side up.
3. Baste and quilt as desired.
4. Trim excess batting and backing.
5. Use your preferred method to bind your quilt using the binding strips.



Monthly Placemats SIMPLE NO BINDING METHOD

FINISHED PLACEMAT SIZE 11" x 18"
MAKES 6 PLACEMATS

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WOF = Width of Fabric

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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Hester & Cook February Monthly Placemat Panel (PD13922-PANEL)

OTHER SUPPLIES

Basic Sewing Supplies

1 yard White Candy Hearts (C13923-WHITE) for backing

2 yards of Lightweight Fusible Woven Interfacing such as Pellon® SF101 Shape-Flex® (20" wide) cut into (6) 11½" x 18½" pieces

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

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- Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.
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February Monthly Placemat Panel

Cut (6) 11½" x 18½"



White Candy Hearts

Cut (6) 11½" x 18½"

PLACEMAT ASSEMBLY

1. Using an iron, fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of each panel, following the manufacturer's instructions.
2. Layer each placemat with the panel and the backing fabric RST. Sew around each placemat using a ¼" seam allowance. Leave about a 3" gap on the bottom.



3. Clip the corners of each placemat, taking care not to cut your stitches. Turn your placemat right side out through the gap.
4. Press the placemat, tucking in the fabric at the gap. Topstitch around the placemat ⅛" from the edge.
