Ruby Bridges (born September 8, 1954)

Ruby Nell Bridges Hall is an activist for racial equality who came to national attention during the Civil Rights movement in the first days of school integration in New Orleans. She became the subject of books, films and even a Norman Rockwell painting. She now chairs the Ruby Bridges Foundation and remains a prominent activist, author, and speaker.




When Ruby Bridges was only six years old, she walked through a mob of angry segregationists and into her school. She and her family faced enormous challenges in the fight for school integration.

Six years prior, the Supreme Court ruled that racial segregation in public schools was unconstitutional in Brown v. Board of Education. Yet despite the landmark decision, many school districts were slow to adhere to the Court's ruling.



Pressured by the federal government, the Orleans Parish school district of Louisiana took the first steps to integrate their schools. In 1960, Ruby Bridges was one of six students who passed the exam that made her eligible to attend the all-white William Frantz Elementary School. At the age of six, Ruby became the school's first Black student.

The painter Norman Rockwell commemorated the iconic image of little Ruby walking to school, surrounded by U.S. Marshals for her protection, in *The Problem We All Live With*.






Repeat on the remaining corners.



This week's designers are Jeresther Page and Mary Davis.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric A square.

With right sides facing, layer the Fabric A square with the Fabric O square.

Stitch 1/4" from each side of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

TRIM Bow Half Square Triangle Unit to measure 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".





Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric N squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric N square on the left end of the Fabric T rectangle.

Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.





Repeat on the right end.

Stem Unit should measure 1 1/2" x 2 1/2".








Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric G and Fabric U squares.

Stitch on the drawn lines and trim 1/4" away from the seams.





Repeat on the top right corner with a Fabric U square and the bottom left corner with a Fabric G square.

Left Apple Unit should measure 4" x 6 1/2".





With right sides facing, layer Fabric N squares on the top right and bottom left corners of a Fabric R rectangle.


Stitch on the drawn lines and trim 1/4" away from the seams.





Repeat on the top left corner with a Fabric U square and the bottom right corner with a Fabric G square.

Right Apple Unit should measure 4" x 6 1/2".







Trim Stop Unit to measure 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".

Stop Corner Unit should measure 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".







Make 4

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric E and Fabric P squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric E square on the top end of a Fabric S rectangle.

Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.





Repeat on the bottom end with a Fabric P square. Look Unit should measure $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ ".





With right sides facing, layer a Fabric E square on the top end of a Look Unit.

Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.





Repeat on the bottom end with a Fabric P square. Stare Unit should measure 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".







Vickeidy Plybon is a high school teacher turned quilter. She comes from a multi-generational family of sewists and makers and has been quilting steadily since 2018.


She is the designer of the Upward Block.

Cut apart on the marked lines.

Trim Upward Unit to measure 4 1/4" x 4 1/4".

Attach top and bottom inner borders using the Fabric C








