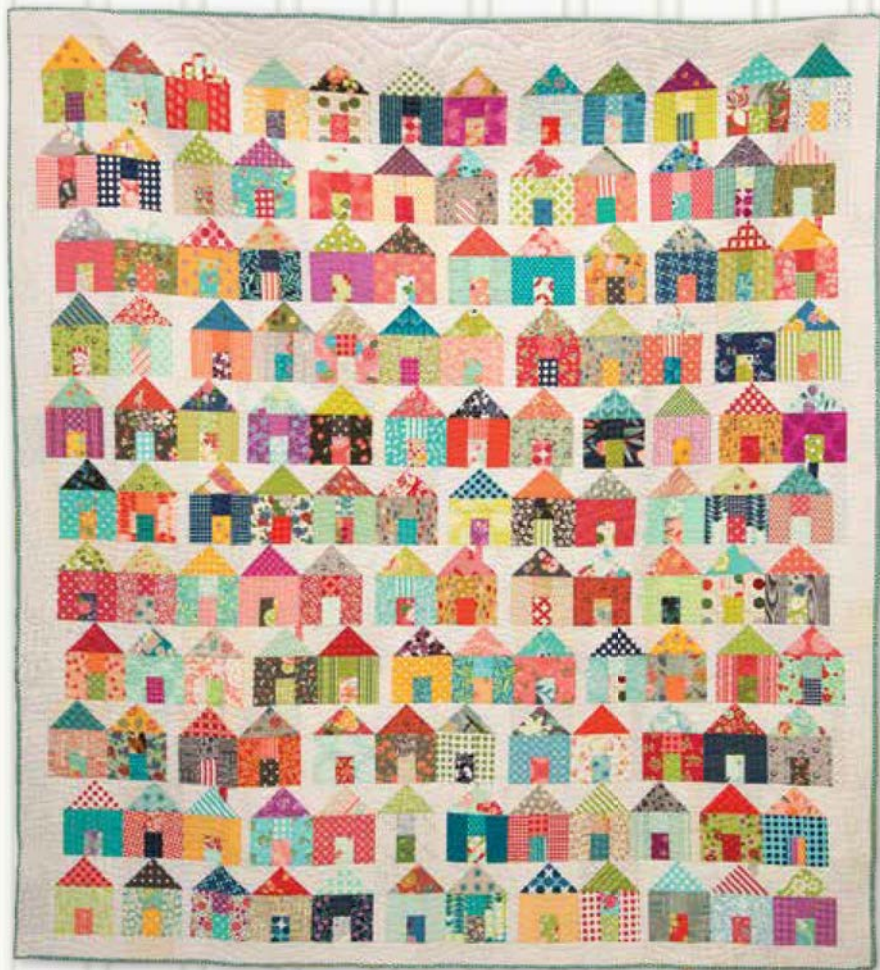

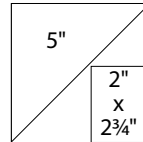
CUTTING

Tip: Because the roof pieces will have a bias edge, starching/sizing the fabrics before cutting is recommended.

Houses– Select at least 297 charm squares.

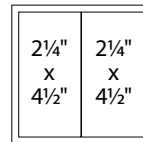
Select 132 charm squares for the roofs & doors.

Cut the squares as shown.



Save the larger of the leftover triangles for the optional chimney piece.

- Cut a 1 ¼" x 2 ½" rectangle for the chimney.



Select 132 charm squares for the sides of the house.

From each square, cut 2 strips–2¼" x 4½".

From the remaining 33 charm squares, cut 4 strips–2" x 2¼".

Background and Border–from 4–⅞ yards, cut:

From EACH of the ⅞-yard pieces cut

4–4" x width of fabric strips

From the strips, cut 35–4" squares (need 132 squares total)

2–2½" x width of fabric strips

From the strips, cut 8–2½" x 10½" rectangles (need 32 total for the border)

From the remainder of the yardage, cut

2–2" x 7", 4–1¾" x 7", 31–1½" x 7", and 23–1¼" x 7" rectangles

Binding–from the ¾ yard, cut:

8–2½" x width of fabric strips

Sew the strips end-to-end using a diagonal seam to make the binding.

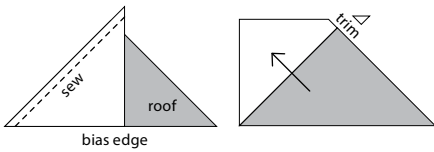
ASSEMBLY

All seams are sewn with a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance

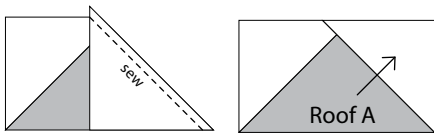
Making one house

There are 2 types of roofs;
 roof A and roof B with a chimney.
 To make roof A or B select the following:
 roof: 1-5" triangle
 background: 1-4" square, cut in half
 on the diagonal

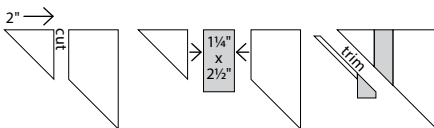
Sew the 4" background triangle to the
 roof triangle. Press and trim.



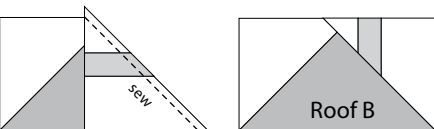
If you are making roof A, add a 4" background triangle to the same roof triangle. Press. *See trimming.*



If you are making roof B, select
 1-1 1/4" x 2 1/2" chimney rectangle.
 Cut a 4" background triangle 2" from
 the point as shown. Assemble the
 chimney, press and trim.

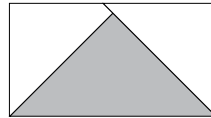
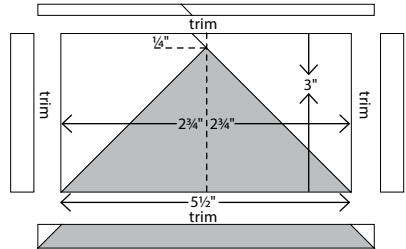


Add the chimney to the roof.
See trimming.



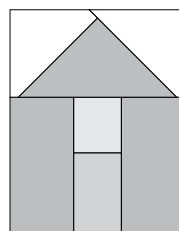
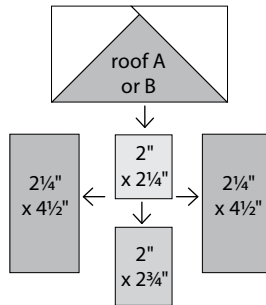
Trimming

Trim roof A or B to 3" x 5 1/2" as shown.
 Be sure to leave a 1/4" seam allowance at
 the top of the roof.

 unfinished
























































To make the house select the following:

 1-2" x 2 3/4" rectangle
 2-2 1/4" x 4 1/2" rectangles



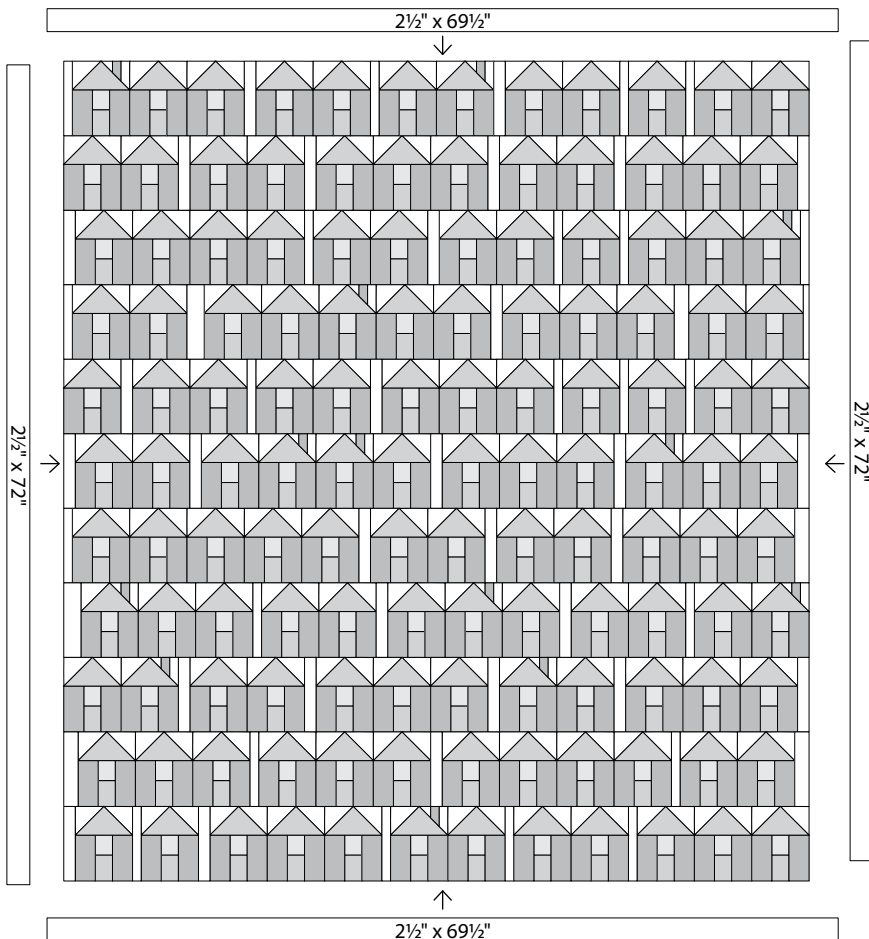

This table shows the arrangement of the houses and background rectangles in the rows. (There are 12 houses in each row.) Arrange and sew the rows. Join the rows.

Sew the 32-2½" x 10½" assorted background rectangles end-to-end. From this long strip cut 2-2½" x 72" and 2-2½" x 69½" borders. Add the 2½" x 72" borders to the quilt sides. Add the 2½" x 69½" borders to the top and bottom. Layer, quilt, and bind.*



* Your quilt will look different depending on how many houses you made with chimneys.

Finished Size is 69" x 75½".

Jumble: A Charm Pack Mash-Up!

I love house quilts - always have, always will. I also love scrap quilts - the more fabric, the happier I am. So when Lissa started laying out all the new fabrics coming at Market, of course I saw it all as a quilt. Charm Packs? It was the only way to easily use every one of the new fabrics! Leave one out? As if?!

And after making more than 80 small quilts with charm packs, adapting one for a big quilt seemed so logical that I had to wonder why it hadn't occurred to me before.

The houses are made with 5" charm squares, and each house uses 2 and 1/4 charm squares. Some parts match, some don't. Each house block finishes at 5" x 6 1/2". There are eleven rows of 12 randomly spaced houses, and some of the houses have chimneys.

The name comes from "it takes a village" because it took the combined talents of at least 16 people to make this all work - the 12 designers whose fabric collections I used, Lissa, Tammy, Lisa, and Maggi, the quilter.

Me? I just showed up at the end.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Squares: At least 297 charm squares* - a minimum of 8 Charm Packs* -

Depending on the assortment of lights and darks, more Charm Packs may be required or desired - more is always better.

Background and Border: 4 assorted 7/8 yards or 3 yards of a single fabric

Binding: ¾ yard

Backing: 4¾ yards

*charm square=5" square

*Charm Pack=42-5" squares



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
