GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Please check www.rileyblakedesigns.com/pattern-updates or scan the QR Code for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of sewing techniques and terminology. The bag diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric. It is not recommended to prewash fabric before cutting and assembling.



Always verify your panel size before beginning. If your panel measurements differ from those given in the pattern, trim to the desired size or use coping strips to alter the size of your panel. If coping strips are needed, add oversized, coordinating strips of fabric to the necessary edges of the panel, then trim to the size specified in the pattern.

WOF = Width of Fabric
RST = Right Sides Together
WST = Wrong Sides Together

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

All fabrics from the Anne of Green Gables collection unless stated otherwise.

(1) PD16128-PANEL Anne of Green Gables Panel
1/3 yard C16126-SAGE Ditsy

OTHER SUPPLIES

Basic Sewing Supplies

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

When cutting fabrics, use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter. Measurements include 1/4" seam allowance. Label, allocate, and organize all cuts as noted.



Anne of Green Gables Panel

Fussy cut (2) 10 1/2" x 11 1/2" Panel rectangles centered over the motifs.*

**Note: If the panel motifs do not reach the edge of the required cuts, add coping strips first and then trim to the required sizes once the strips are added.*



Sage Ditsy

Cut (1) 10 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
(2) 10 1/2" x 11 1/2" rectangles for lining.
(2) 3" x 16" rectangles for handles.

SEWING TECHNIQUES

Sew all seams RST and with a 1/4" seam allowance unless stated otherwise. Refer to the diagrams for placement of the prints. Press seams as desired unless stated otherwise. Dimensions listed in steps are unfinished sizes.

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BAG ASSEMBLY

1. With WST, fold and press the long edges of (1) Handle rectangle in half lengthwise to create a center crease; open the strip. Next, fold and press each long edge of the rectangle in $\frac{1}{4}$ " toward the center crease. Fold the rectangle on the center crease so the raw edges are now encased and topstitch along both long edges to make (1) Bag Handle. Repeat to make a second handle.




Make (2)



$1\frac{1}{4}" \times 16"$

2. Pin (1) Bag Handle to (1) Panel rectangle, aligning raw edges and positioning each handle end $2\frac{1}{2}"$ from the side seams. Baste in place with a $\frac{1}{8}"$ seam allowance to make (1) Bag Front. Repeat with the second Bag Handle and the remaining Panel rectangle to make (1) Bag Back.


3. Place the Bag Front and Bag Back RST, making sure the handles are sandwiched between the layers of fabric. Sew along the side and bottom edges to make the Bag Body. Turn right side out.

4. Place (2) Lining rectangles RST. Sew along the side and bottom edges, leaving a 3" opening along the bottom for turning to make the Bag Lining. Do not turn right side out.

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5. Insert the Bag Body into the Bag Lining and align the side seams. Make sure the Bag Body and Bag Lining are RST and the handles are sandwiched between the layers of fabric.
6. Sew around the top edge. Turn right side out through the opening in the Bag Lining and press. Topstitch along the top of the bag if desired. Sew the lining opening closed by machine or by hand to complete the bag.
