
Cutting:

Background	8 - 3 1⁄8" squares	Α
 	4 - 3 ½" squares	В
 	8 - 3" squares	С
1 	4 - 1 ½" x 9 ½" rectangles	D
	2 - 2 ½" x 19 ½" strips	Е
1 	2 - 2 ½" x 23 ½" strips	F
*Leaves (3 FQs)	From each print, cut	
1 1 1 1	2 - 3 1/8" squares (6 total)	G
1 1 1	4 - 3 ½" squares (12 total)	Н
Leaves & Cornerstone (1 FQ)	2 - 3 1⁄8" squares	G
	1 - 1 ½" square	1
**Stems & Binding (1 FQ)	4 - 3 ½" squares	J
	7 - 2 1/4" x 18" strips (binding)	Κ


Fabric Requirements:

- Background: 5/8 yard
- Blocks, Cornerstone & Binding: 5 Fat Quarters
- Backing: % yard or use the leftover scraps from your Fat Quarters to make a Pieced Backing

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Maple Leaf Blocks:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric A squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric A square with a Fabric G square.

Stitch 1/4" from each side of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

Leaf Unit should measure 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".







Make 16.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric C squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric C square on the top right corner of a Fabric J square.

Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.





Repeat on the bottom left corner.

Stem Unit should measure 3 ½" x 3 ½".







Make

Assemble Block.

Maple Leaf Block should measure 9 1/2" x 9 1/2".






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Quilt Center:


Assemble Quilt Center. Press toward the background. Quilt Center should measure 19 ½" x 19 ½".



Borders:

Attach side borders using the Fabric E strips.

Attach top and bottom borders using the Fabric F strips.



Optional Pieced Backing:

Assemble four 12 ½" squares from the leftover fabric. Pieced Backing should measure: 24 ½" x 24 ½".

Note: This backing is only 1" larger than the quilt top so use lots of pins and take your time when quilting to make sure your backing stays in place. If you are using a longarm quilter they may request a larger backing.





Finishing:

Piece the Fabric K strips end to end for binding. Quilt and bind as desired.
