Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42 " wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, fussy cut:

six 11 " $\times 13$ " rectangles for the Block 1 centers

## From Fabric B, cut:

five 3-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 3-7/8" squares for the Block 2 flying geese
two 3-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
four 3-3/4" $\times 17^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
four 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 2-3/4" x 12-1/2" rectangles for the Block 2 borders
ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" $\times 17^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Block 1 outer borders twelve $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15$ " rectangles for the Block 1 outer borders

From each of Fabric $C$ and $D$, cut:
four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 1-1/2" x $13^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the Block 1 inner borders
From each of Fabric $E$ and $F$, cut:
two 7-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
six 7-1/4" squares for the Block 2 flying geese
From Fabric G, cut:
six 1-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two 1-1/2" x 49-1/2" top/bottom inner borders
two 1-1/2" $\times 68-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side inner borders
From Fabric H , cut:
four 4-1/2" $\times$ length of fabric strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 4-1/2" $\times 76-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side inner borders
From the remaining width of fabric, cut: five 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 4-1/2" $\times 51-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom inner borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Step 1: Pin two 3-7/8" Fabric B squares in opposing corners of a Fabric E square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.


Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.


Step 4: Place one 3-7/8" Fabric B square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 5: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to $3-1 / 2 " \times 6-1 / 2$ " if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.

Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 3-7/8" Fabric B squares and 7-1/4" Fabric E and Fabric F squares to make a total of:

twenty-four Fabric E flying geese blocks

twenty-four Fabric F flying geese blocks

Note that in the Fabric F units, the direction of the print is different in each of the four flying geese made in each set.


Assemble the Block 1 Units


Step 7: Gather:
one Fabric A block center
four $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strips
two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strips
two 2-1/2" x 17" Fabric B strips
Step 8: Sew a Fabric D strip to the top and bottom of the block center. Press toward the strips. Sew a Fabric D strip to the left and right of the block center. Press toward the strips.

Step 9: Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the block center. Press toward the strips. Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 17$ " Fabric B strip to the left and right of the block center. Press toward the strips.

The resulting block should measure 17" x 19". Repeat Steps 7-9 to make three Block 1 units with Fabric D borders and three Block 1 units with Fabric C borders.



## Step 10: Gather:

four Fabric E flying geese
four Fabric F flying geese (one of each orientation) two $2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strips

Step 11: Arrange the flying geese, following the fabric placement and orientation shown in the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the flying geese together to form pairs (pressing the seams to the top) before sewing the pairs together to form a four patch. Press the seams in opposite directions in the rows and press the final row seam open or to one side.

Step 12: Sew a $2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the block center. Press toward the strips.

The resulting block should measure 17" x 12-1/2". Repeat Steps 10-12 to make six Block 2 units.


Step 13: Arrange the Block 1 units, Block 2 units and $3-3 / 4$ " $\times 17$ " Fabric $B$ strips into four rows of three blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 15: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Step 16: Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 17: Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
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
