## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## From Fabric A, cut:

six 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end to end, then trim:
one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 35-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the top outer border
one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the top outer border one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 59-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the right outer border one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the left outer border one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 24-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the left outer border one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the bottom outer border
one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 6-1/2" $\times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle
eight 1-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Section C. one 1-1/2" $\times$ 9-1/2" strip for Section A. one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the left outer border. one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for the TOP outer border.
Set aside the seven remaining full WOF pieces for strip piecing the striped sections.
From Fabric B, cut:
fifteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one 1-1/2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Section A.
one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Section B. one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Section E.
Set aside the fourteen remaining full WOF pieces for strip piecing the striped sections. three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" strip for Section E.
Set aside the two remaining full WOF pieces for strip piecing the striped sections.

## From Fabric C, cut:

two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing the striped sections.
one $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle

## From Fabric D, cut:

one 14-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 14-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangle
Trim the remainder of the strip to 12-1/2" wide, then subcut: one $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle
Trim the remainder of the strip to $6-1 / 2$ " wide, then subcut: one 6-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangle

From Fabric E , cut:
Following the cutting diagram, subcut: one $18-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one $18-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one 11-1/2" $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle


## From Fabric F, cut:

Following the cutting diagram, subcut: one $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one 9-1/2" square one $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 18-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing the striped sections.


From Fabric G, cut:
two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing the striped sections.
three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Section E.
Set aside the two remaining full WOF pieces for strip piecing the striped sections.

## From Fabric H, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing the striped sections.
five $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing the striped sections.
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Strip Pieced Sections

Step 1: Sew a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide. Repeat to make five strip sets like this. Subcut to make:
three $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units
six $15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ units

Step 2: Sew the three 5-1/2" long units together, adding a 5-1/2" Fabric A strip to the Fabric B end. Press the seams open. Set aside for the outer left border.

Step 3: Sew the three 12-1/2" long units together, adding a 12-1/2" Fabric A strip to the Fabric B end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section C.


Step 4: Sew the eight 7-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section C.

Step 5: Sew the six 15-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section E.


Step 6: Sew a 1-1/2" Fabric B strip to a 1-1/2" Fabric C strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be 2-1/2" wide. Repeat to make two strip sets like this. Subcut to make:
six $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units
seven 6-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 7: Sew the six 5-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section B.

Step 8: Sew the seven 6-1/2" long units together, adding a 6-1/2" Fabric B strip to the Fabric $C$ end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section E.

Step 9: Sew a 1-1/2" Fabric A strip to a 1-1/2" Fabric F strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be 2-1/2" wide. Repeat to make two strip sets like this. Subcut to make:

three 9-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units
three $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 10: Sew the three 9-1/2" long units together, adding a 9-1/2" Fabric A strip to the Fabric $F$ end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section A.


Step 11: Sew the three $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long units together, adding a $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip to the Fabric F end. Press the seams open. Set aside for the top outer border.

Step 12: Sew a $1-1 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be 2-1/2" wide. Repeat to make five strip sets like this. Subcut to make:

five $15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units
six $11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 13: Sew the five $15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long units together, adding a $15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the Fabric H end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section B.

Step 14: Sew the six 11-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section D.


Step 15: Sew a 1-1/2" Fabric B strip to a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be $2-1 / 2$ " wide. Repeat to make two strip sets like this. Subcut to make:
$\square$ two $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

two $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 16: Sew the two 12-1/2" long units together, adding a 12-1/2" Fabric B strip to the Fabric $G$ end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section A.

Step 17: Sew the two 5-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section A.

Step 18: Sew the seven 6-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section A.

Step 19: Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip. Press the seams open. The strip should be 4-1/2" wide. Subcut to make:
$\square$ four 9-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 20: Sew the four 9-1/2" long units together, adding a 9-1/2" Fabric B strip to the Fabric $H$ end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section E.


Step 21: Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G strip. Press the seams open. Make two strip sets like this. The strip sets should be 4-1/2" wide. Subcut to make:

three 9-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

four 12-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ units

Step 22: Sew the three 9-1/2" long units together. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section D.


Step 23: Sew the four 12-1/2" long units together, adding a 12-1/2" Fabric G strip to the Fabric B end. Press the seams open. Set aside for Section E.

## Assemble Section A



Step 24: Gather the units shown. Sew together in three rows, pressing the seams to one side. Sew the three rows together to complete Section A.

Assemble Section B


Step 25: Gather the units shown. Sew together in two sections, as shown, pressing the seams to one side. Sew the two sections together to complete Section B.

## Assemble Section C

Step 26: Gather the units shown. Sew together in one row, pressing the seams to one side, to form Section C.

## Assemble Section D



Step 27: Gather the units shown. Sew together in one column, pressing the seams to one side, to form Section D.

Assemble Section E


Step 28: Gather the units shown. Sew together as one top row and four columns, as shown, before sewing the two units together, pressing the seams to one side to form Section E.

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 29: Sew Section A to the left of Section B. Press.
Sew Section C to the bottom of Section AB. Press.
Sew Section $D$ to the right edge of Section $A B C$. Press.

Sew Section E to the bottom edge of Section $A B C D$. Press.
Sew the left and right outer borders to the quilt center. Press.
Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
