Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (8) 3" x 50-1/2" strips. • (1) 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" strips. • (1) 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 2-1/2" x 20-1/2" strips. • (2) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (16) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips. • (3) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) 2-1/2" squares. • (2) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (4) 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" strips. • (2) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. 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Quilt Block Assembly


Pay attention to the orientation of the units when assembling the components of the quilt top.

1. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for the Easy Dresden Tool to make (20) **C** large plates, (20) **E** medium plates, (20) **F** small plates and (1) **B** center circle.

2. Sew (5) **C** plates together to make (1) **Unit 1** block (**Fig. 1**). Repeat to make (4) **Unit 1** blocks total.

3. Sew (4) **Unit 1** blocks together to make (1) **Unit 2** block (**Fig. 2**).


4. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to **Figures 3-6** for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) **Unit 4** block and (1) **Unit 5** block.



5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, press fusible web on to the wrong wide of each **Unit 2**, **Unit 4**, **Unit 6** and **B** center circle.

6. Refer to **Figures 7-10** to arrange and press the **Unit 2** block onto the center of the **D** 16-1/2" square. Press the **Unit 4** block onto the center of the **Unit 2** block. Press the **Unit 6** block onto the center of the **Unit 4** block and press the **B** circle onto the center of the **Unit 6** block.

7. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) **Unit 7** square.





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8. Place (1) **A** 3-1/2" square on the top left corner of (1) **Unit 7** square, right sides together (**Fig. 11**). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (**Fig. 11**). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Flip open the triangle formed and press (**Fig. 12**).

9. Follow **Figure 13** for the seam direction to add an **A** 3-1/2" square to each of the remaining corners of the **Unit 7** square to make one (1) **Unit 8** square (**Fig. 14**).



10. Place (1) **A** 2-1/2" square on the left side of (1) **J** 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strip, right sides together (**Fig. 15**). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (**Fig. 15**). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press (**Fig. 16**).

11. Place another **A** 2-1/2" square on the right side of the **J** 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strip, right sides together (**Fig. 17**). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (**Fig. 17**). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press to make (1) **Unit 9** strip (**Fig. 18**).

12. Repeat **Steps 10-11** to make (24) **Unit 9** strips total.

13. Sew (2) **Unit 9** strips together lengthwise to make (1) **Unit 10** square (**Fig. 19**). Repeat to make (12) **Unit 10** squares total.



14. Sew (4) **A** 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips and (3) **Unit 10** squares together, alternating them, to make (1) **Unit 11** strip (**Fig. 20**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 11** strip.

15. Sew (4) **A** 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips and (3) **Unit 10** squares together, alternating them, to make (1) **Unit 11** strip (**Fig. 20**). Sew (1) **G** 4 1/2" square to each end of the new strip to make (1) **Unit 12** strip (**Fig. 21**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 2** strip.





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16. Sew (1) **D** 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" strip to each end of (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip to make (1) **Unit 13** strip (**Fig. 22**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 13** strip.



17. Sew (1) **D** 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" strip to each end of (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip to make (1) **Unit 14** strip (**Fig. 23**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 14** strip.



18. Sew (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" strip to each side of the **Unit 8** square. Sew (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 20-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 8** square (**Fig. 24**).

19. Sew (1) **Unit 11** strip to each side of the **Unit 8** square. Sew (1) **Unit 12** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 8** square (**Fig. 24**).

20. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 28-1/2" strip to each side of the **Unit 8** square. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 8** square (**Fig. 24**).

21. Sew (1) **Unit 13** strip to each side of the **Unit 8** square. Sew (1) **Unit 14** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 8** square (**Fig. 24**).

22. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 34-1/2" strip to each side of the **Unit 8** square. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 36-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 8** square to make the **Center Block** (**Fig. 24**).



23. Sew (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" strip to each side of (1) **H** 9-1/2" square. Sew (1) **A** 2-1/2" x 13-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **H** square. Trim the block to measure 12-1/2" square to make (1) **Block One** square (**Fig. 25**). Repeat to make (4) **Block One** squares total.




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24. Sew (1) **J** 2" square to the top and to the bottom of (1) **C** 2" square. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of (1) **C** 2" x 5" strip lengthwise to make (1) **Unit 15** square (**Fig. 26**). Repeat to make (4) **Unit 15** squares total.


25. Sew (1) **J** 1-3/4" x 5" strip to each side (1) **Unit 15** square. Sew (1) **J** 1-3/4" x 7-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 15** square to make (1) **Block Two** square (**Fig. 27**). Repeat to make (4) **Block Two** squares total.

26. Sew (1) **J** 1-1/2" square to the top and to the bottom of (1) **C** 1-1/2" square. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of (1) **C** 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" strip lengthwise to make (1) **Unit 16** square (**Fig. 28**). Repeat to make (24) **Unit 16** squares total.

27. Sew (1) **J** 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) **Unit 16** square to make (1) **Block Three** strip (**Fig. 29**). Repeat to make (24) **Block Three** strips total.



28. Sew (6) **Block Three** strips and (5) **J** 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" strips together lengthwise and alternating them. Sew (1) **J** 2" x 7-1/2" strip to each end of the new strip to make (1) **Unit 17** strip (**Fig. 30**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 17** strip.





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29. Sew (6) **Block Three** strips and (5) **J** 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" strips together lengthwise and alternating them. Sew (1) **J** 2" x 7-1/2" strip to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) **Block Two** square to each end of the sewn strip to make (1) **Unit 18** strip (**Fig. 31**). Repeat to make a second **Unit 18** strip.



30. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip to each end of (1) **B** 7-1/2" x 40-1/2" strip. Sew (1) **I** 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip to each end of the sewn strip. Sew (1) **A** 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) **A** 3" x 50-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the sewn strip to make (1) **Unit 19** strip (**Fig. 32**). Repeat to make (4) **Unit 19** strips total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Diagram while assembling the quilt top.)

31. Sew (1) **Unit 17** strip to each side of the **Center Block**. Sew (1) **Unit 18** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Center Block**.

32. Sew (1) **Unit 19** to each side of the **Center Block**. Sew (1) **Block One** square to each end of (1) **Unit 19** strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the **Center Block** to make the quilt top.

Quilt Finishing

33. Layer and quilt as desired.

34. Sew the (8) **J** 2-1/2" x WOF strips together end-to-end with 45-degree seams to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.


35. Bind as desired.

C		51116-5 celedon	1/2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (1) 10-1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 10-1/2" x 15-1/2" strips. (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 2" x 12-1/2" strips. (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 2" x 15-1/2" strips.

Pillow Assembly

Pay attention to the orientation of the units when assembling the components of the quilt top.

36. Sew (1) **B** 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" strip to each side of (1) **A** 9-1/2" square. Sew (1) **B** 2-1/2" x 13-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **A** square. Trim the block to measure 12-1/2" square to make (1) **Unit 1** square (**Fig. 33**).

37. Sew (1) **C** 2" x 12-1/2" strip to each side of the **Unit 1** square. Sew (1) **C** 2" x 15-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 1** square to make (1) **Unit 2** square (**Fig. 34**).





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38. Remove the paper backing from the large and small leaves.
39. Refer to **Figure 35** to arrange and press (2) **A** large leaves and (2) **A** small leaves onto the **Unit 2** square.
40. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the pillow front.
41. Turn under the 15-1/2" edge of the **C** 10-1/2" x 15-1/2" strip approximately 1/4", press and repeat to make a finished edge on (1) edge of the **C** strip. Repeat with the second **C** 10-1/2" x 15-1/2" piece.
42. Position and pin each back envelope flap, right sides together with the pillow front, overlapping the finished edges in the middle and aligning the raw edges with the pillow front (**Fig. 36**). Stitch around the pillow front and back to complete the pillow.
43. Turn the pillow right side out.
44. Insert the pillow form to complete the pillow.




