

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### Choose the Half Square Triangle Method that works best for you!

Option #1 - Cutting on the left uses the Triangles on a Roll Method (TOAR).

Option #2 - Cutting on the right uses the Traditional Method.

Use 1/4" seams and press as arrows indicate throughout.

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TOAR METHOD FOR LARGE HST:


With right sides facing, layer the Fabric A square with the Fabric H square.

Place a two by two section of 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Finished Half Square Triangle Paper on top and pin in place.

Set stitch length to 1.5 and sew on the dotted lines.

Cut apart on the solid lines.

Large Half Square Triangle Unit should measure 4" x 4".





### **TRADITIONAL METHOD FOR LARGE HST:**

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric A squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric A square with a Fabric H square.

Stitch 1/4" from each side of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

Large Half Square Triangle Unit should measure 4" x 4".





### TOAR METHOD FOR FIRST SMALL HST:


With right sides facing, layer a Fabric C square with a Fabric J square.

Place a two by two section of 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Finished Half Square Triangle Paper on top and pin in place.

Set stitch length to 1.5 and sew on the dotted lines.

Cut apart on the solid lines.

First Small Half Square Triangle Unit should measure  $2 \frac{1}{4}$  x  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ .



Make 8 from each print. Make 32 total.

You will not use 2 from each print.

## TRADITIONAL METHOD FOR FIRST SMALL HST:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric C squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric C square with a Fabric J square.

Stitch 1/4" from each side of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

First Small Half Square Triangle Unit should measure  $2 \frac{1}{4}$  x  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ .







Make 6 from each print. Make 24 total.

Assemble four matching First Small Half Square Triangle Units.


First Pinwheel Unit should measure 4" x 4".





Assemble Block.

Corner Block should measure 7 1/2" x 7 1/2".











### TOAR METHOD FOR SECOND SMALL HST:


With right sides facing, layer a Fabric B rectangle with a Fabric I rectangle.

Place a two by three section of 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Finished Half Square Triangle Paper on top and pin in place.

Set stitch length to 1.5 and sew on the dotted lines.

Cut apart on the solid lines.

Second Small Half Square Triangle Unit should measure  $2 \frac{1}{4}$  x  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ .



Make 12 from each print. Make 48 total. You will not use 2 from each print.

TRADITIONAL METHOD FOR SECOND SMALL HST:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric B squares.

With right sides facing, layer a Fabric B square with a Fabric I square.

Stitch 1/4" from each side of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

Second Small Half Square Triangle Unit should measure  $2 \frac{1}{4}$  x  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ .






Make 10 from each print. Make 40 total.

Assemble four matching Second Small Half Square Triangle Units.

Second Pinwheel Unit should measure 4" x 4".






Assemble two matching Second Small Half Square Triangle Units and one Fabric E rectangle.

Outer Unit should measure 2 1/4" x 7 1/2".





Assemble Block using matching fabric. Side Block should measure 7 1/2" x 7 1/2".



Assemble Block using eight First Small Half Square Triangle Units and eight Second Small Half Square Triangle Units.

Press seams open.

Center Block should measure 7 1/2" x 7 1/2".






quilt center:

Assemble Quilt Center. Press open.

Quilt Center should measure 21 1/2" x 21 1/2".










borders:

notes:

Attach side borders using the Fabric F strips. Attach top and bottom borders using the Fabric G strips.



finishing:

Piece the Fabric K strips end to end for binding. Quilt and bind as desired.
