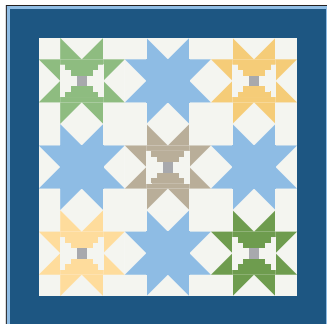
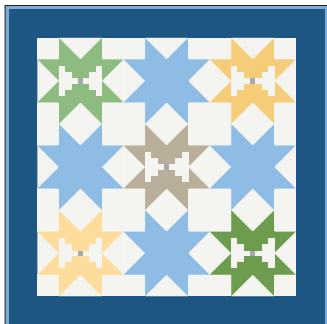

Fabric Requirements:

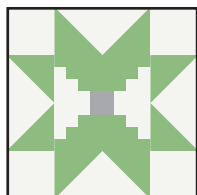
- Background: 1 2/3 yards
- 5 Windfall Blocks: 5 Fat Quarters
- Accent: Fat Eighth
- Setting Star Blocks: 3/4 yard
- Borders: 7/8 yard
- Binding: 5/8 yard
- Backing: 3 1/8 yards

Follow the cutting and block assembly instructions in the Serendipity Release #3 Windfall Row Pattern for your blocks.

Background	16 - 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles 16 - 3 ½" squares	8 - 7" x 7 ¾" rectangles 16 - 3 ½" squares	A B
Setting Star Print	4 - 6 ½" squares 32 - 3 ½" squares	4 - 6 ½" squares 16 - 4 ½" squares	C D
Borders	2 - 4 ½" x 36 ½" strips 3 - 4 ½" x width of fabric strips		E F
Binding	6 - 2 ½" x width of fabric strips		G

3" x 6" Flying Geese Foundation Paper:
8 sheets



Use ¼" seams and press as arrows indicate throughout.

Setting Star Block Assembly:

Flying Geese Traditional Method:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric D squares.

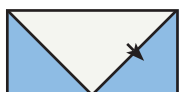
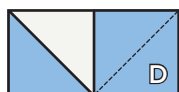
With right sides facing, layer a Fabric D square on one end of a Fabric A rectangle.

Stitch on the drawn line and trim ¼" away from the seam.



Repeat on the opposite end.

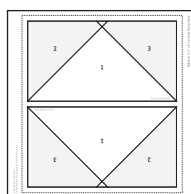
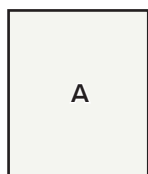
Flying Geese Unit should measure 3 ½" x 6 ½".



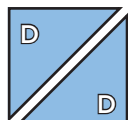
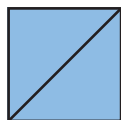
Make sixteen.

Flying Geese Foundation Paper Method:

Following the instructions on the Flying Geese Foundation Paper, layer a Fabric A rectangle in the Placement 1 position on the Flying Geese paper.



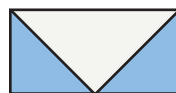
Cut the Fabric D squares on the diagonal once.



Make thirty-two.

Following the instructions on the Flying Geese Foundation Paper, layer the Fabric D triangles in the Placements 2 and 3 positions on the Flying Geese paper.

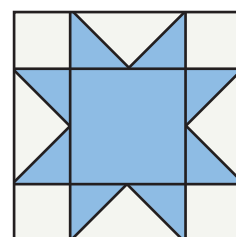
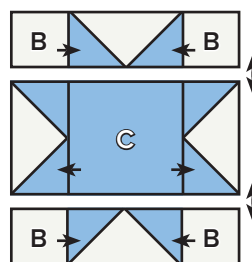
Flying Geese Unit should measure 3 ½" x 6 ½".



Make sixteen.

Assemble Block.

Setting Star Block should measure 12 ½" x 12 ½".

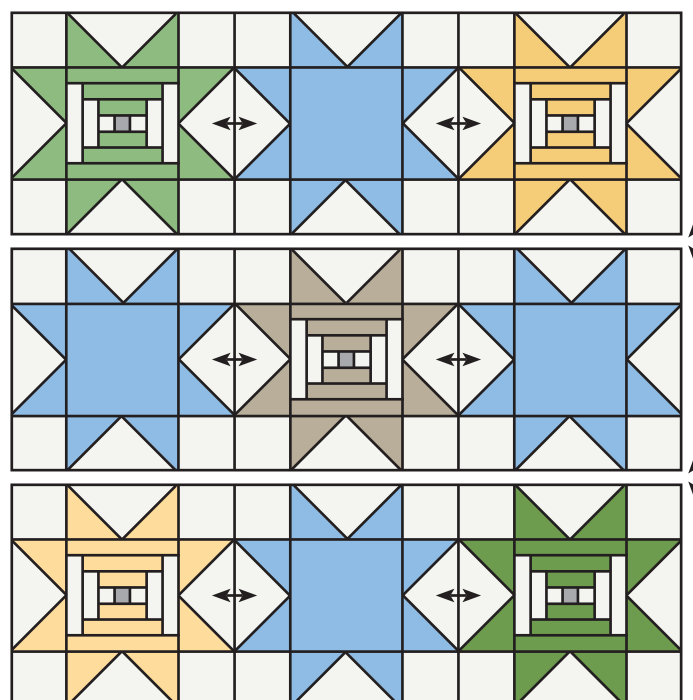


Make four.

Quilt Center:

Assemble Quilt Center.

Quilt Center should measure 36 ½" x 36 ½".



Borders:

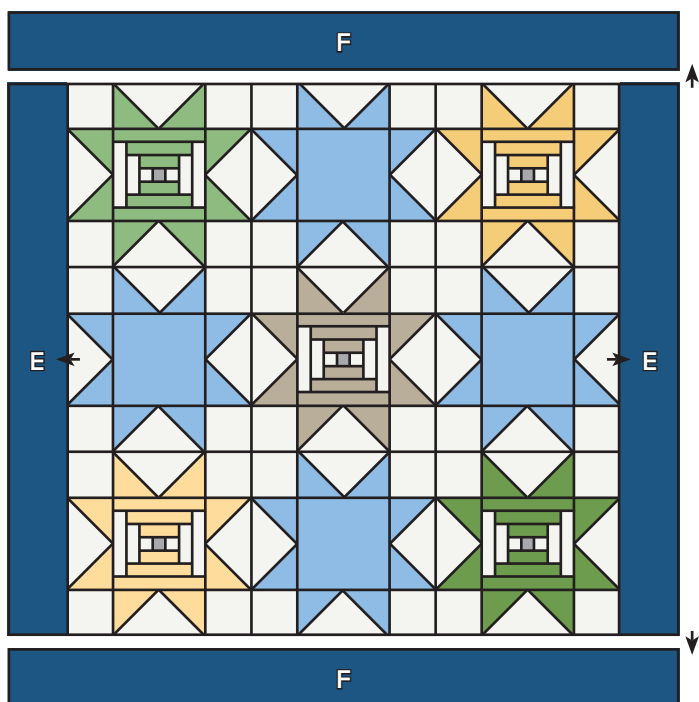
Piece the Fabric F strips end to end.

Subcut into:

2 - 4 ½" x 44 ½" strips (Top and Bottom Borders - F)

Attach side borders using the Fabric E strips.

Attach the Top and Bottom Outer Borders.

Finishing:

Piece the Fabric G strips end to end for binding.

Quilt and bind as desired.
