

COOK BOOK APRON PANEL INSTRUCTIONS

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INSTRUCTIONS

Please read through all the directions first before starting and assume ¼" seam allowance unless otherwise stated. There are three different Cook Book Apron Panels to choose from. These instructions show only one of them, but the assembly is the same for all three.

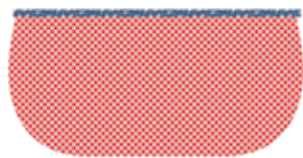


REQUIREMENTS

1 Cook Book Apron Panel (HD11770, HD11771 & HD11772)
7 Yards ¼" Double Folded Bias Tape (ST-24567 OR ST-24568)

ASSEMBLY

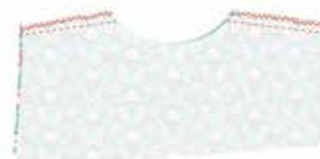
1. Cut out the apron front, back, and bottom pocket.
2. Fold bias tape across the top of the pocket and topstitch on. Make sure that you are catching the underside of the bias tape as you are sewing.



3. Place the pocket right side up onto the bottom end of the apron front and align edges. Sew pocket onto apron around sides and bottom using an 1/8" seam allowance. Leave the top end of the pocket with bias tape open. If you would like a divider in your pocket, top stitch down the center to form a divided pocket instead of one large pocket.



4. Place the shoulder seams of the apron front and apron back with wrong sides together and pin. Stitch using a 1/4" seam allowance. Zigzag or serge seams to prevent fraying.



5. Sew the bias tape around the neck opening, starting and stopping at the back of the neck. Fold the end of the bias tape under at the end for a nice finish.



6. Cut (4) 12" long pieces of bias tape to use for ties. Topstitch folded edges closed. Pin onto apron sides in front and back approximately 12" up from the bottom. Align raw edges and pin ties so that they are facing inside the apron.

7. Sew bias tape all round edges of the apron starting on the back where one of the ties is pinned. As you are sewing, take care to catch the underside of the bias tape and catch the edges of the ties as you are stitching. Fold the end of the bias tape under at the end for a nice finish.

8. Tie on your apron and enjoy!

9. Use the bonus quilt block to decorate your kitchen by making it into a pillow, wallhanging, chair pad, placemat, etc.
