10" square Halloween Gunny Sack (C736)

5" square Riley Lime Solid (C120)

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

- Please read instructions before cutting fabrics.
- Refer to the quilt photo and layout diagram for fabric placement.
- Label the pieces as you cut.



From Black Bats, cut:

4 strips 2½" × WOF for binding

1 strip 5½" × WOF; subcut:

2-5%" × 10%" rectangles subcut 3 strips 1%" × 21"+; subcut:

 $2 - 1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $10\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

From Halloween Pin Dot, cut:

Cut 1 Fat Quarter in half into 2 Fat Eighths (9" \times 21"). Each Fat Eighth equals 1 Ghost. Layer the 2 Fat Eighths to cut 2 Ghosts at the same time.

2 – 5½" × 8½" rectangles

QUILT ASSEMBLY

- Orient the cut pieces following the pertinent illustrations while constructing the table runner.
 Doing so is essential to understand positional terms such as top, bottom, left side, right side and so on.
- All angled seams are constructed using the Stitch & Flip method. The method is described next and referenced throughout the pattern.


Stitch & Flip Method (S&F)

Place 2 pieces right sides together matching raw edges in one corner. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the smaller piece across the corner. Stitch on the drawn line. Trim the seam allowance above the sewn line to $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Flip the small piece away from the bottom piece and press, replacing the corner.




Ghost Blocks (G)


 Using the S&F method, replace the top corners of rectangle Gb with C squares, making a Head unit.




2. Using the S&F method, replace the top corners of rectangle G with squares Gf, to make a Flying Geese (FG) unit. Make 4 FG units $(2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $1\frac{1}{2}$ ").



- 3. Arrange the Ghost Block following the diagram below (a). Sew the pieces together side-to-side in rows. Sew rows together to create the Ghost $(8\%'' \times 12\%'')$.
- 4. Sew F strips to each side of the Ghost. Sew strip H to the bottom to complete the Ghost Block (b) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " × $13\frac{1}{2}$ ".







5. Repeat Steps 1-4 to make a second Ghost Block.

Pumpkin Block (P)

1. Using the S&F method, replace the top corners of 2 Pa rectangles with C squares to make Unit 1. (One will be turned upside down for the pumpkin bottom.)




- 2. Using the S&F method, replace the bottom left corner of 2 Pc 9. Repeat Steps 6 & 7 to complete the Mouth unit (c & d). rectangles with a B square, to make 2 of Unit 2.
- 3. Repeat Step 2, replacing the top left corner of 2 Pc rectangles with B squares, to make 2 of Unit 3.




The next steps are a modified version of the S&F method.


- 4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of rectangle Pd from upper right to lower left (a).
- 5. RST, position one end of the drawn line on rectangle D's lower right corner. Swivel the other end of the drawn line to the left side of rectangle D (b).




- 6. Sew on the drawn line. Trim seam allowance below the stitched line ¼" (c).
- 7. Open the triangle and press (d).



8. Repeat Steps 4 – 5 using a second Pd rectangle. This time, draw the diagonal line from upper left to lower right (a). Position the drawn line on rectangle D's upper right corner and swivel again to the left side of rectangle D (b).





10. Arrange the Pumpkin pieces following the diagram below, turning Units 1, 2, & 3 as needed. Sew pieces together sideto-side into rows. Sew rows together to make a Pumpkin. Sew strip F to the bottom of the pumpkin to complete the Pumpkin Block (12½" × 10½").




Table Runner Assembly

Following the Table Runner layout diagram, arrange the Ghost and Pumpkin Blocks in a row with rectangles I in between. Sew the blocks and rectangles together side-to-side to complete the Table Runner Center (48½" × 10½").

Pieced Border

Sew together 16 J rectangles end-to-end to make a pieced side border. Make 2 and sew 1 to each side. The Table Runner measures 48½" × 14½".

Finishing

Finish the table runner by layering the runner top, batting, and back. Bind with 2%" Black Bats strips.
