## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-six 4" squares.
six 2-3/8" $\times$ WOF strips for strip sets. two 2 " x WOF strips. Subcut: six $2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.

From each of Fabrics B and E, cut:
two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven $2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. seven 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.

From each of Fabrics C and J, cut: two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
seven $2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. eight 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2$ " rectangles.

From each of Fabrics $D$ and $G$, cut:
two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2 " $\times 6-1 / 2$ " rectangles. eight 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2$ " rectangles.

From each of Fabrics F, H, and I, cut: two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2 " $\times 6-1 / 2$ " rectangles. seven 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric K, cut:
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3-1/2" squares.

From Fabric L, cut:
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: nine 3-1/2" squares.

From Fabric M, cut:
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 4" squares.
two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one 2 " x 12 " rectangle.
thirty-two 2 " squares.

## From Fabric $\mathbf{N}$, cut:

seven 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 2" squares.
Sew the remainder of the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:
two $2^{\prime \prime} \times 63-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side inner borders.
two 2" x 48-1/2" top/bottom inner borders.
one $1-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip for strip sets.
From each of Fabrics $O$ and $P$, cut:
two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six 2" squares.
From each of Fabrics Q-U, cut:
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
six 4" squares.
Trim the remainder of the strip to 2 ", then subcut:
one 2 " $\times 12$ " rectangle.

## From each of Fabrics V-Z, cut:

one 1-5/8" x WOF strip for strip sets.
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Make the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric M square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twelve A/M HSTs.


Step 2: Repeat step 1 to make:

twelve A/Q HSTs

twelve A/T HSTs

twelve A/R HSTs

twelve A/U HSTs

Step 3: Gather:
one $2-3 / 8$ " x WOF Fabric A strip one $1-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric $N$ strip

Place the two strips right sides together with one long edge aligned. Sew along the matched long edge, then press the seam towards the darker fabric.


Step 4: Repeat to make:

> one A/V strip set

one A/W strip set

one $A / X$ strip set

one $A / Y$ strip set

one A/Z strip set


Step 5: Cut each strip set into twelve 3-1/2" segments. Keep the matching segments organized together.


Step 6: Gather:
one 2" $\times 12^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle
one 2 " $\times 12^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $M$ rectangle
Place the two strip right sides together with the long edges aligned. Sew along one long edge, then press the seam towards the darker fabric.


Step 7: Repeat to make:


Step 8: Cut each strip set into six 2 " segments.


## Assemble the Four-Patch

Step 9: Gather the 2" segments. Note: If you wish to match our cover quilt, see the Quilt Assembly Diagram for Fabric pairings.

Select two segments and place them right sides together. Be sure the Fabric A portion of the top segment is touching the Fabric M, Q, R, S, T or U on the segment beneath it. Sew the two segments together, then press the seam open or to one side.

Step 10: Repeat to make eighteen four-patches. Set the remaining segments aside for another project.

## Assemble the A Blocks



## Step 11: Gather: <br> one four-patch <br> four matching $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ segments four matching HSTs <br> Arrange the units in three rows of three as shown.

Step 12: Sew the units together to form rows. Press the seams towards the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ segments. Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press the seams open or in one direction.

Step 13: Repeat to make eighteen A blocks. You can make your own fabric
 combinations or refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for the fabric pairings used in our cover quilt.

## Assemble the B Blocks

Step 14: Gather:
one 3-1/2" Fabric K square
four 2" Fabric M squares
four 2" Fabric N squares
four $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle in a variety of fabrics
four $2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle in a variety of fabrics
Step 15: Sew a $2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to both sides of the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric K square. Press.

Step 16: Sew a 2 " Fabric $M$ square to both ends of a 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Press. Repeat to make a second strip like this.

Step 17: Sew the two strips with the Fabric M squares to the top and bottom edges of the strip with the Fabric K square. Press.


Step 18: Sew a 2 " $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to both sides of the unit. Press.


Step 19: Sew a 2 " Fabric $N$ square to both ends of a 2 " x 6-1/2" rectangle. Press.

Step 20: Sew the two strips to the top and bottom fo the unit. Press to complete the block.

Step 21: Repeat to make eight B Blocks.


## Assemble the C Blocks

Step 22: Gather:
one 3-1/2" Fabric L square
four 2" Fabric O squares
four 2" Fabric P squares
four 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle in a variety of fabrics
four 2 " $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle in a variety of fabrics
Step 23: Sew a 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to both sides of the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $L$ square. Press.

Step 24: Sew a 2" Fabric P square to both ends of a 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Press.

Step 25: Sew the two strips with the Fabric P squares to the top and bottom edges of the strip with the Fabric L square. Press.


Step 26: Sew a $2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to both sides of the unit. Press.


Step 27: Sew a 2 " Fabric O square to both ends of a 2 " $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Press.

Step 28: Sew the two strips to the top and bottom fo the unit. Press to complete the block.

Step 29: Repeat to make nine C Blocks.


## Assemble the Quilt



Step 30: Arrange the blocks into seven rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 31: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 32: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Step 33: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 34: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
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
