

It's A Girl!

FINISHED QUILT SIZE: 51" × 59"

Measurements include ¼" seam allowance. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting techniques and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Multi It's A Girl panel (P13325)

% yard Coral Gingham (C13323) includes binding

34 yard Blush Main (C13320)

⅓ yard White Bouquet (C13321)

⅓ yard Sage Floral (C13324)

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

Please read instructions before cutting fabrics. Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics. Label the pieces as they are cut.

Baby Girl panel

Cut 1 rectangle 35%" × 43%", centering the design.



Coral Gingham

Cut 4 strips 3" × WOF. E

Cut 6 strips 2%" × WOF for binding.



Blush Main

Cut 4 strips 6" × WOF.

White Bouquet

Cut 1 strip 4½" × WOF; subcut:

4-4½" squares C

Cut 2 strips 2½" × WOF; subcut:

32-2½" squares B



Sage Floral

Cut 3 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × WOF; subcut:

16- 2½" squares D

 $16-4\%" \times 2\%"$ rectangles A

QUILT ASSEMBLY:

Refer to the cutting requirements list, quilt cover art and layout diagram for the placement of prints.

All angled pieces are constructed using the Sew & Flip method. This method is described next and referenced in the pattern.

Sew and Flip Method (S&F)

- Place a square right sides together on a base square or rectangle, matching the raw edges in the corner to be replaced.
- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the top square across the corner.
- Sew on the drawn line. Trim the corner ¼" from the stitching.
- Flip the top piece away from the bottom piece and press. The original corner has been replaced.

Sew & Flip Method (S&F)








Corner replaced


Corner Stars

Using the S&F method, replace the top 2 corners of rectangle **A** with **B** squares to make a Flying Geese Unit $(4\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ "). Make 16.




Flying Geese Unit

Sew a Flying Geese Unit to each side of an $\bf C$ square to make a Star Center Row (8½" × 4½"). Make 4.




Sew a D square to each end of the remaining Flying Geese Units to make a Flying Geese Row ($8\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ "). Make 8.



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
Sew a Flying Geese Row to the top, another to the bottom of a Star Center Row to complete the Star block (8%" × 8%"). Make 4.



Inner & Outer Borders

- 1. Sew 2 E strips together end-to-end to make a double-length strip. Repeat to make 2.
- 2. Repeat Step 1 using F strips. Make 2.

- 3. From each Border Strip cut 2 Side Border 43½" long, and 2 Horizontal Border 35½" long.
- 4. Layout the borders as shown in the quilt border diagram and sew E and F together as shown. Note the directional print on the outer border. Make 2.



- 5. Sew a 43½" Side Border to each side of the quilt panel, making sure the Coral Gingham print sits next to the panel.
- 6. Sew a Star block to each end of both 35%" Horizontal Borders. Sew 1 to the top, the other to the bottom of the quilt panel. Quilt now measures 51%" \times 59%".

Finishing

Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and back. Quilt as desired. Bind with 2½" Coral Gingham strips.

Have fun and enjoy the journey of making your quilt.
