# BRIGHT STARS Panel Quilt

#### FINISHED QUILT SIZE 57" x 64"

Measurements include ¼" seam allowance. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting techniques and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

**WOF** = Width of Fabric **RST** = Right Sides Together

#### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Bright Stars Panel (P13108-PANEL) 1 yard Navy Main (C13100-NAVY) % yard Griege Dots (C13105-GREIGE) ½ yard Burgundy Stars (C13106-BURGUNDY) ⅓ yard Natural Stars (C13106-NATURAL) <sup>5</sup>⁄<sub>8</sub> yard Navy Stars (C13106-NAVY) - for binding

#### **OTHER SUPPLIES**

**Basic Sewing Supplies** 2 yards WIDEBACK Backing 66" x 73" piece of Batting

#### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS**

- Please read instructions before cutting fabrics.
- Cutting Instructions are based on a 42" WOF.
- Refer to the quilt photo for the placement of each of the fabrics.
- Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.
- Actual panel measurements may vary from digital panel measurements. Therefore, trimming instructions are provided for the panel and all borders to ensure accuracy. Follow trimming instructions carefully. Accurate measuring techniques are key.

#### Panel

Trim excess fabric from the panel by measuring a ¼" outside of the outermost color illustrations for the seam allowance. Cut away excess background fabric from the panel. Panel should measure approx.  $35\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

#### **Border Pieces**

Piece strips longer than WOF by joining strips on short ends. Use excess from strips to make subcut strips.



Navy Main (Label as Fabric A) Cut (6) 5½" x WOF; subcut: (2) 5½" x 54½" strips (2) 5½" x 57½" strips



**Griege Dots** (Label as Fabric B) Cut (5) 3½" x WOF; subcut: (2) 3½" x 47½" strips (2) 3½" x 48½" strips

Burgundy Stars (Label as Fabric C) Cut (5) 2½" x WOF; subcut: (2) 2½" x 40½" strips (2) 21/2" x 421/2" strips



**Natural Stars** (Label as Fabric D) Cut (9) 1" x WOF; subcut: (2) 1" x 40½" strips (2) 1" x 41½" strips (2) 1" x 421/2" strips (2) 1" x 471/2" strips

**Navy Stars** (Label as Fabric E - Binding) Cut (7) 21/2" x WOF

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#### QUILT ASSEMBLY

- Take your trimmed panel (approximately 35½" x 42½") and sew (2) 1" x 42½" Fabric D strips to each side (lengthwise) border.
- 2. Next, sew (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strips to the Fabric D strips from Step 1. The quilt top should measure approximately  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished at this step.



- 3. Sew (2) 1" x 40½" Fabric D strips to each top and bottom border.
- Next, sew (2) 2½" x 40½" Fabric C strips to the Fabric D strips from Step 3. The quilt top should measure approximately 40½" x 47½" unfinished at this step.



- 5. Sew (2)  $1'' \times 47\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric D strips to each side border.
- Next, sew (2) 1" x 41½" Fabric D strips to each top and bottom border. The quilt top should measure approximately 41½" x 48½" unfinished at this step.



- 7. Sew (2)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips to each side border.
- 8. Next, sew (2)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $47\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips to each top and bottom border. The quilt top should measure approximately  $47\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $54\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished at this step.



- 9. Sew (2)  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $54\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strips to each side border.
- Next, sew (2) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 57<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric A strips to each top and bottom border. The quilt top should measure approximately 57<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 64<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" unfinished at this step.



### FINISHING THE QUILT

Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Bind with (7) 2½" x WOF Fabric E strips. Have fun and enjoy the journey of making your quilt!
